Policy Title: Sanctioning of National-International Championships and Events

Date Approved: March 31, 2009

I – POLICY

In compliance with the Canadian Curling Association policy stating that the Member Association must sanction all bid requests of National and International events within their jurisdiction, any NSCA Member Curling Club who is interested in hosting a National or International event must forward, in writing, a request to the Board of Directors of the NSCA to sanction their bid - included in this letter will be the Host Committee Profit Distribution formula.

II – PROFIT DISTRIBUTION

All National and International events are divided into two categories, Major and Minor Events.

Major events will be, but not limited to, Men's National Championship, Women's National Championship, Olympic Trials and World Men's and World Women's Championships. All Major events will be run by an *ad hoc committee* of the NSCA. The Host Committee must agree and submit in writing to both the CCA and the NSCA:

- to pay % of any realized revenue from the base payment and secondary revenue to the NSCA plus
- to agree to the CCA paying the NSCA % of the CCA revenue.

Minor events will be, but not limited to, events hosted in Curling Clubs or arena's seating under 1,500 people. These events will include Junior Men's and Women's National Championship, Senior Men's and Women's National Championship, Mixed National Championship, Masters Men's and Women's Championship and the Canada Cup.

- The Host Committee must agree to the following profit sharing formula based on gross revenues generated:
 - \$0 - \$15,000. %
 - \$15,001. - \$99,999. %
 - \$100,000.00 and over %
